WYOMING COUNTY 4-H CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

The Wyoming County 4-H Program celebrated “100 Years of Growing Strong Leaders” on Sunday, June 12, 2022. The afternoon event took place between the rain showers at the Wyoming County Fairgrounds and offered 4-H families an opportunity to reconnect, reminisce, and reflect with one another.

The youth building at the fairgrounds housed historical 4-H displays and memorabilia for attendees to browse. 4-H projects, plaques, and photos kept over the years by members as memories were submitted by many families. Each family received commemorative ribbons for exhibiting their items. Current 4-H clubs filled booths with colorful displays, covering the rich history of our 4-H program.

A pie contest was also held where adults and youth submitted their homemade, double crust, fruit pies for judging. In the adult category – Sally Woods placed first with her three-season pie. Mary Fuller placed second with her apple pie and Sarah Marsh placed third with her apple pie. In the youth division, Peyton and Abby Mest placed first with a blackberry pie. Veronica George placed second with her strawberry pie and Emma Johnson placed third with her peach pie. Additional youth contestants were Ian Johnson and Adelia Green.

The Agricultural Expo Center hosted a variety of activities for attendees. Food was offered by the Pike Volunteer Fire Company and Catered Creations. Yummies served up ice cream sundaes to attendees, courtesy of Wyoming County 4-H Leaders’ Association. The Crazy Country Kids 4-H Club hosted a scavenger hunt and carnival games. Carlson’s Studio provided a photo booth for attendees to have pictures taken. Youth played old fashioned yard games and participated in relay races throughout the afternoon. Kelly’s Old Timer’s played music for all to enjoy which was sponsored by the Wyoming County Farm Bureau. Square dancing was a hit with multiple generations of 4-H families taking to the barn arena floor to dance together while others enjoyed listening and watching!

The event concluded with a formal ceremony to commemorate the program’s 100-year history. CCE Wyoming County Executive Director, Abby Griffith welcomed the crowd and thanked everyone in attendance for their dedication to the program. Nathan Paddock, 4-H Program Committee Chairman, recognized Wyoming County 4-H members in attendance from both past and present. Louise Herrick, 4-H Leaders’ Association President led recognition of our program’s volunteer 4-H leaders. County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca Ryan presented a proclamation, recognizing the program for “100 years.” Jim Brick, Town of Perry Supervisor shared a proclamation from Senator Patrick Gallivan and closed out the event leading everyone in the 4-H Pledge.

A commemorative booklet highlighting the first 100 years of Wyoming County 4-H was presented at the event and is available for pick up in the 4-H office or can be found on our website. Thank you to everyone who contributed towards and attended the event. Our 4-H program has been successful for 100 years because of dedicated 4-H families, volunteers, staff and community support!

The exhibit booths in the Youth Building at the Wyoming County Fair are available on a first come, first serve basis. Booths are 58" wide, 35" deep, and 6' 9" high. Each booth receives a minimum of \$25.00, plus points added accordingly to the ribbon received.

The 1st place blue ribbon booth will receive an additional \$15, 2nd place \$10, and 3rd place \$5.

The quality of the booths in recent years has been excellent. This is a good club fundraiser. It is encouraged to have club displays, as well as 4-H club parade floats, be in some way tied in with the fair theme.

All traditional booth spaces have been filled for the 2022 fair. If your club would like a booth space, contact the 4-H office by July 15th, arrangements can be made to construct additional space if desired.

Six ribbons will be awarded per class with a trophy awarded to each divisions' high point winners. In classes under six riders, points will be awarded at the judge's discretion.

Horses need up-to-date **Coggins paperwork** (done in 2021 or 2022.) **Rabies shots** are also required for exhibition and must have been given within the past 12 months. All riders must have a **horse certificate** on file with the 4-H office for valid entry. *All entries must be mailed, dropped off, or emailed to the 4-H office with health paperwork and payment attached by July 15th.* No money will be handled the day of the show to limit contact at the entry booth.

BIOSECURITY FOR HORSE EVENTS

Any time horses are congregated at events, owners increase the chance that their horses may be exposed to an infectious disease agent. An example is EHV-1. Pathogens may be brought to and spread at an event by horses, people, domestic animals other than horses, vehicles, equipment, insects, ticks, birds, wildlife including rodents, feed, waste and water. By following these simple guidelines, you can help minimize that risk.

- Consult your veterinarian to establish an appropriate vaccination program for your horse(s).
- Tie your horse(s) to your trailer. If using a stall, clean and disinfect it, if possible, before stalling your horse. Always use clean, fresh bedding.
- Minimize your horse(s) having direct contact with unknown horses, especially nose to nose contact.
- Use your own water and feed buckets. Avoid letting your horse(s) drink from a communal water trough. Fill water buckets from a faucet.
- Do not share grooming equipment or tack. If you must, then wash and disinfect it before returning to your own horse(s).
- Avoid petting and touching other horses in order to minimize the risk of transferring a disease back to your horse. If you must handle other horses then wash your hands or use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid letting strangers pet your horse especially if they have horses of their own.
- Before returning home from an event clean up your equipment (boots, tack, grooming supplies, buckets, etc.) to help reduce the risk of transporting an infectious agent back home. Consider washing and disinfecting your trailer when you return home.
- If possible, isolate your returning horses for 2 weeks or at least prevent nose to nose contact with your other horses.

Don't forget to consult your veterinarian concerning these and other steps you can follow which may reduce the risk of your horse acquiring an infectious disease while traveling. For more details visit:

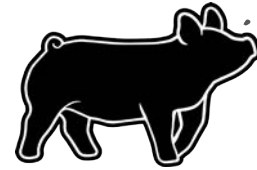

90 DAY PULLORUM TESTING FOR POULTRY

Wednesday, July 13th from 5:00pm to 6:30pm
Poultry & Rabbit Barn at Wyoming County Fairgrounds

To exhibit poultry at the fair, they must be accompanied by 1) results of a negative pullorum-typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition or 2) proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock. Waterfowl DO NOT need to be tested. Only birds over 4 months of age will be tested. Please call the 4-H office by July 11th if you plan to bring chickens for testing. (Broiler project animals do not need to be tested.)

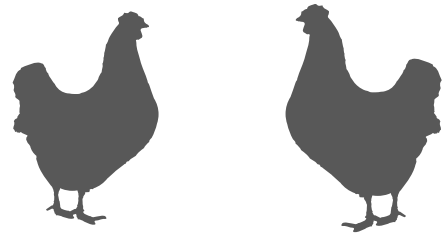

BIOSECURITY AT THE FAIR

These practices contribute to keeping your animals healthy and help to protect Wyoming County Agriculture. Adapted from California Department of Food and Agriculture, Biosecurity at the Fair brochure.

BIOSECURITY BEFORE THE FAIR

Disease prevention and fair biosecurity start before exhibitors leave home. Only healthy animals should be entered in the fair. Before animals leave the home premises, the herd or flock veterinarian should examine each animal to ensure healthy animals enter the fairgrounds. Tools and equipment may harbor disease agents. To minimize potential disease spread from the home premises to the fair, before packing for transport, clean and disinfect: Feed equipment: buckets, feeders, hay racks. Cleaning utensils: shovels, pitch forks and wheelbarrows. Grooming equipment: clippers and brushes. Vehicle and trailer (inside and outside).

BIOSECURITY AT THE FAIR

To protect fair animals and minimize disease transmission risk while at the fair: Limit animal-animal contact. Limit animal-human-animal contact. Avoid sharing equipment with other exhibitors unless you thoroughly clean and disinfect between use. Cover feed and equipment to reduce risk of contamination. Change clothing, hats, and shoes used at the fair before doing chores at home. At the end of the fair, clean all animals returning home and disinfect all equipment before loading the trailer. Unused feed, hay and bedding should be discarded at the fairgrounds, not taken home.

BIOSECURITY AFTER THE FAIR

The possibility of animal exposure to disease agents can occur with even the best biosecurity practices at the fair. Since they may be harboring disease agents without clinical signs, animals returning from the fair should be isolated from other animals and pets. Monitor animals in isolation daily for signs of illness and contact the herd or flock veterinarian if any unusual symptoms are observed. To minimize the possible chance of disease spread to the main herd or flock, modify your chore routine to care for isolated fair animals last. Keep equipment used in caring for isolated fair animals away from other animals in the herd or flock. Change your clothes after completing chores for isolated animals. Consult your veterinarian to develop an isolation plan suitable for your premises and herd or flock. Use of fair biosecurity is a good management practice.

MEAT ANIMAL MID-WAY WEIGHT CHECK

Saturday, July 9th

This is an opportunity for meat animal participants to bring project animals to the fair for a weight check if you do not have access to scales at home. You will be responsible for offloading, getting your animals to and from the scales, and reloading them on your truck or trailer. This is totally optional but a good opportunity if you are unsure of how your project animals are doing in terms of weight. Contact Holly in the 4-H office with any questions for more details.

SUMMARY OF ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE WYOMING COUNTY FAIR

A complete summary of health requirements can be found in the front of the Fair Book!

1. Rabies shots must be given to cattle, horses, dogs, and sheep that are 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to the fair. It is recommended that rabies shots also be given to goats and hogs. The vaccine must be given at least 14 days prior to the fair and within the last 12 months. When a booster shot is given to a previously vaccinated animal, the shot must be given prior to coming to the fair.
2. Animals must be free of all contagious diseases such as ringworm, warts, mange, orf, respiratory infections and contagious hoof infections. Warts must be removed and healed prior to coming to fair.
3. **Cattle, Sheep, Goats and Swine must be identified by USDA approved official identification. Call the 4-H office if you have any questions about acceptable forms of ID.**
4. For New York State animals, certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) is required. This is a health chart (Form AI 61). The CVI is often referred to as "health papers" or "health certificate." This chart must be completed on or after May 1st of the current year. All animals, even those under 3 months of age, need to be individually identified and included on the health chart.
5. Tuberculosis testing on New York State cattle will not be required.
6. A signed written statement from the attending veterinarian is required as proof of vaccination.
7. Cattle must be vaccinated against Bovine Respiratory Disease Complex (shipping fever, etc. Vaccination must include immunization against bovine viral diarrhea (BVD), bovine respiratory syncytial virus (BRSV), infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR), and Parainfluenza (PI3) with a product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of fair.
8. Observe milk and meat drug/vaccine labeled withholding times. (Usually 21 days is required between giving a rabies shot and slaughter and 21 days on the Bovine Respiratory shots.)
9. Out of state animals coming to the fair must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species. The interstate health chart is valid for 30 days from the date of issuance with regard to entrance into New York State. Import test requirements are different for different states, based on diseases that are found in that state. For more detailed information contact N. Y. S. 10. If any sheep or goat within a flock shows evidence of Soremouth, the whole flock must be removed from the fairgrounds.
11. Sheep and goats must be identified with an official scrapie tag or tattoo. In order to prevent scrapie contamination, any sheep or goat showing any uterine drainage will be sent home.

Observe drug/vaccine labeled withholding times!

CATTLE

- Health chart
- Rabies vaccination
- All cattle must be identified by a USDA approved eartag.
- Vaccination for Bovine respiratory disease complex
- Negative BVD-PI Test results; date of test and results must be noted on CVI.

SHEEP

- Health chart with veterinarian statement indicating that there are no contagious diseases in the flock/herd.
- Rabies vaccination
- Identified with an official scrapie tag or tattoo

HORSES

- Coggins test for E.I.A., must be done in 2021 or 2022
- Rabies vaccination-signed statement of vaccination by vet, must include serial number and name of product used.

GOATS

- Health chart with veterinarian statement indicating that there are no contagious diseases in the flock/herd.
- Rabies vaccination is recommended for fair!
- Identified with an official scrapie tag or tattoo

SWINE

- Health chart with animals individually
- All swine must be identified with a USDA approved eartag
- Vets MUST record entire tag number sequence on the CVI (example: 21HOG1234)
- Rabies vaccination is strongly recommended for county fair but is required for state fair.
