





Cancellations will also be listed on the Wyoming County 4-H Facebook page by 4:30pm on the day of the event. Sometimes the weather is bad in one part of the county and not in others; please use your judgement when deciding to travel. Rescheduling meetings is very difficult so if at all possible, meetings and events will be held.

4-H OFFICE FOCUS!

This year in each edition of the 4-H News, we will highlight an interview with a staff member from our team.

First up is Caron Gala. Caron is the Executive Director for CCE Wyoming and has been with the association since May 2024. You can reach out to Caron by stopping in at the office, calling her at 585-786-2251, or emailing her at ceg256@cornell.edu.

Holly Harwood: Can you tell us a little bit about yourself?

Caron Gala: Sure! I'm from Lockport, NY, a rural area surrounded by farmland. I have a graduate degree in soil chemistry and fertility from Virginia Tech. After living in Maryland for 20 years, I'm excited to be here and part of the team. I'm also a big Buffalo Bills fan, love sports like volleyball, and enjoy staying active. I also grow black raspberries as a hobby.

Holly Harwood: How do you see your role as the Executive Director for CCE in Wyoming County?

Caron Gala: My goal is to connect the team with resources and support. You, Holly, lead an excellent livestock program, and with experts like Stephanie Czerniak and Sarah Clark, we're positioned to build on strengths in dairy and hospitality. We're launching initiatives like the Champions program to teach youth about local governance and agriculture and introducing tech-based learning in 4-H to tackle farm challenges. I've worked on these areas with land-grant universities for years and am eager to see them take off here.



Holly Harwood: What is your vision for the current strategic planning process taking place for CCE Wyoming County?

Caron Gala: It's all about aligning county needs with our programs. We've gathered community feedback through meetings, focus groups, and surveys to identify what's working and what needs improvement. Areas like agriculture, hospitality, STEM, and fundraising are key focus points.

Holly Harwood: How can 4-H families participate in the strategic planning process?

Caron Gala: Families can join focus groups or complete our online survey. Paper copies are also available, but online submissions streamline data collection.

Holly Harwood: Is there anything else you would like to share with 4-H families as we move into the new year?

Caron Gala: 4-H is for everyone! Families can sign up individually to find projects that match their interests. We're recruiting volunteers and working to make the process easier. I am also excited to learn more about livestock production from families here in Wyoming County. On a personal note, I'd love suggestions for local spots—ice cream shops, restaurants, or activities. I want to learn more about what makes this community special!

NEW member enrollments are due to the 4-H office by March 31st to participate in the market/meat animal swine, lamb, goat, and poultry auction projects.

April (at first dog meeting) - New members must be enrolled to participate in Dog Obedience Project.

NEW members may enroll until June 1st to participate in most other 4-H project areas and exhibit at fair.

Re-enrolling members - if youth enroll after November 30th of the program year, an additional \$5/youth late fee will be added to their enrollment cost.

New Members - if youth enroll after April 15th of the program year, an additional \$5/youth late fee will be added to their enrollment cost. (new members are defined as not being enrolled in the previous program year.)

• Any 4-H club that is planning to raise funds for club activities, apparel, supplies, etc... needs to submit a "Request for Permission to Raise Funds in the Name of 4-H" form (Took L-20 in the Leaders' Handbook) to the 4-H office.

- Forms should be submitted to the 4-H office at least 30 days prior to the proposed fundraising date for approval.
- Fundraising events where food is prepared and sold, need a "Community Dinner Permission" from the Wyoming County Health Department. Contact the 4-H officce at 585-786-2251 for info on this simple process.

With each public presentation, there is an increas in self-confidence, poise, self-esteem, stage presence and knowledge. Public presentations can teach a 4-H'er lifetime skills that will be useful in his or her future social, educational and career pursuits.

It is important for 4-Hers to begin doing Public Presentations at an early age and continue throughout their 4-H career. Public speaking skills develop over time, with experience and repetition.



We strongly encourage all 4-H members (non-Cloverbuds) to participate in the 2025 4-H fundraising sale. If every 4-H member sells \$100 worth of product, this sale would be a success. In 2024, only 30% of our membership participated in our fundraiser. *Considering this, we have included an "opt out" option for families who do not want to participate by selling products. If you choose to not participate, please consider giving a \$20 per child "opt out" donation in lieu of active fundraising participation.* This opt-out donation can be paid to the fundraising chairs, or the 4-H office directly via cash or check. Please do not hesitate to contact our office with any follow-up questions or concerns.

The 2025 4-H Fundraiser Sale will run <u>Monday, February 17th through Sunday, March 2nd.</u> Orders will be due to your selected fundraiser chairperson on Monday March 3rd. Our anticipated delivery date of products will be Thursday April 3rd, for distribution that Friday and Saturday (subject to change).



All orders are final, and orders will only be placed if all payment accompanies the final order on March 3rd. Incentive sheets must be turned into your fundraiser chair with your order to be valid. Gift certificates will be offered as incentive prizes. Incentives will only be honored if the incentive sheet is filled out and turned into the cookie chair with your complete order. Incentives will be based off the dollar value of total sales per individual; details can be found on the incentive sheet. The top three sellers will receive a gift certificate towards the value of their sale, plus an exclusive 4-H engraved Stanley IceFlow Thermos.



Explore the different cuisines around the world, along with their cultures and heritage!

There are hundreds of cultures and cuisines across the globe, we challenge you, as 4-H independent and club members, to select a country and research the origins of the foods they eat and their culinary histories and traditions!

It's easy! As a club (or independent member), pick a nation in the world you are interested in exploring! Over the next several months, gather information on the region's cuisine, including styles of cooking or special dishes, and the history or origins of the food item(s) or recipes. You may choose a country or region of the USA.

As an opportunity to highlight what members learn from participating in this experience, Wyoming County 4-H will host a 'Delicious Destinations – Exploring Foods throughout the World' event on Monday evening, April 14th, 2025. In planning for an evening that will be interesting and enjoyable for everyone, your club (or independent members) should be prepared to:

- Share samples of a food/dish that is representative of your region/city with other participants.
- All food samples must be prepared prior to the event, and prepackaged for distribution.
- Plan a short presentation (5 minutes max) to share what you have learned with others.
- Put together a small display highlighting what you learned by participating in the project (i.e. posters, photographs, clothing, recipes, etc.)

Pre-registration is required as spacing is limited. This will provide a great opportunity for everyone to discover 'delicious destinations' by sampling foods and sharing information, without leaving Wyoming County (or even the room)! Call the 4-H office for questions or to sign up by April 1st!

Then join us on April 12th in making pillowcases. Each 4-H participant will pick out their fabric combination to make a pillowcase. The workshop is **free**. The only



HORSING Around



Horse Certificates must be in file on the 4-H office for each individual horse and rider combination to be used in 4-H events. They are due June 1st which is a Wednesday this year, no exceptions. Certificates are available online at wyomingcounty4h.com or in the 4-H office.

All 4-H members participating in the horse program must fill out an Acknowledgement of Risk Form with appropriate horse activities checked. This was part of your enrollment packet this year. This paperwork must be on file in the 4-H office in order to participate in any 4-H riding activities. Call the 4-H office with any questions.

Make sure up to date Rabies & Coggins paperwork is on your person at shows! Copies need to be submitted to the 4-H office with fair entries by July 15th!

Watch your email for supplemental event dates!

To be eligible to show at the Wyoming County Fair in 2025, youth must attend at least one educational opportunity, denoted by asterixis on the calendar. Youth who go above and beyond and attend multiple events will receive educational recognition at the horse banquet in September. Youth must sign the registration sheet and stay for the duration of the event to receive full credit.




