We will require youth who apply to sell at least \$100 of product, or participate in the new opt out option that will be outlined with upcoming fundraiser information in this year's sale - as proceeds from our annual 4-H Fundraising Sale helps to fund these trips and other awards. 4-H award trips provide a wonderful opportunity to visit interesting places, do exciting things, meet fascinating people, spread the word about Wyoming County 4-H, and make great memories!!!

Note: Award trips are subject to change without notice. In the event of a canceled trip, efforts will be made to provide another trip opportunity for participants.

PENNSYLVANIA FARM SHOW January 3 - 5,2025

Travel to Harrisburg, PA and attend the 2025 Pennsylvania Farm Show, the largest indoor agricultural event in America. The Farm Show Complex houses 24 acres under roof, spread throughout 11 building including three arenas. The Farm Show has something for everyone including a family living center, culinary displays and contests, livestock and horse shows, commercial agriculture displays and much more! While at the Farm Show Complex, the group will also attend the Pennsylvania High School Rodeo. On the way home, tentative plans are to visit Hershey's Chocolate World in nearby Hershey, PA to learn about their chocolate making process and Indian Echo Caverns in Hummelstown, PA.

CORNING EXPERIENCE: April 14 - 15, 2025



CAPITAL DAYS: May 18 - 20, 2025

Travel to Albany, NY for the 4-H Capital Days program! The purpose of this trip is to help youth achieve a better understanding of the scope of New York State Government, to create an awareness of career opportunities in State government, and to meet and exchange ideas with State Legislators and 4-H delegates from other counties. In addition to meeting your legislators, you will view the Senate/Assembly in session, tour the Capitol, and visit the NYS Court of Appeals, the NYS Museum, and various state agencies.







VERMONT CAREER EXPLORATION

June 5-6, 2025*tentative dates



This career exploration adventure will take you to various businesses in Vermont where you will have an opportunity to learn about their unique path to building their respective creative and successful businesses. Tour sites will include places like King Arthur Flour, Ben & Jerry's, and some of New England's "best kept secrets". We will also be joining and traveling with other 4-H teens and adults from the south-central part of NY state. Recommended for teens interested in entrepreneurship, food and culture.



** Eligibility requirement: Youth ages 14 and up before January 1, 2025, are encouraged to apply.

AGRI-BUSINESS CAREER CONFERENCE: October 2025 (Thurs. - Fri.)

4-H members will be selected to attend this two-day conference in the fall of 2025. This career exploration trip is held at SUNY Cobleskill and is open to all youth ages 14 and over who are interested in becoming more aware of the great diversity of agri-business related careers available in New York. It will feature mini-tours to farms and operations in the Cobleskill area, as well as seminars, guest speakers, and guided tours of the SUNY Cobleskill's agriculture facility. 2025 tours included:

4-H CAREER EXPLORATIONS: June 25 - 27, 2025 *tentative dates



Career Explorations is a three-day event for youth on the Cornell University campus. The purpose of this program is to provide youth with exposure to academic fields and career exploration, to develop leadership skills, to provide hands-on experience in a college setting and to introduce you to Cornell University. Last year, over 450 youth from all over NY State participated in this program! The event is made up of two grade specific tracts: University U for youth entering grades 8 - 9 and Focus for Teens for youth entering grades 10 – 12.

UNIVERSITY U

Welcomes "U"!! This program offers a series of workshops addressing issues and questions important to "U". This program also offers an introduction to science and technology career opportunities. This past summer, youth involved in the University U program attended six of the following ten tours or workshops: Breaking Bonds and Changing Color; How We Control the Flow of Light; Polymer Chemistry; Breathing Life into Robots; Careers and Climate; Medical Devices: How Your Body Works; Rockets!; Nano Engineering; Gist and the Brain; and Synthetic Biology. Participants also have the opportunity to discover Cornell University and the excitement of college life.



**Eligibility requirement: Students entering the 8th and 9th grades (or the equivalent) in the fall of 2025.

FOCUS FOR TEENS

Focus for Teens is a program where teens spend three days with a specific department or program at Cornell University. The program allows you to have fun while learning about such topics such as Exploring the Solar System and the Universe; Fossil Collecting and the Science of Paleontology; League of Coders; Learning to Program Robots with Baxter; Masterminds in our Midst (Art Museum); Media Corps; 4-H Geospatial Sciences (GPS, GIS, Remote Sensing, UAVs); A Tour of Human Development Across the Lifespan; Cardiac Engineering; Dress Code (parallels between computer coding and fashion); Engineering the Microbiome; Environmental Engineering; Our World of Polymers and Nanoparticles; Rockets, Boats, and Bridges (applications in mechanical and aerospace engineering); So you want to be a Food Scientist (building your own ice cream company); Vet for a Day, Women in Science; and more. Pick the topic you want to focus on and learn what Cornell has to offer!



**Eligibility requirement: Teens must be entering their sophomore, junior or senior year of high school (or the equivalent) or freshman year in college in the fall of 2025.
