






2023 Wyoming County 4-H **Cookie Sale**

Monday February 20th - Sunday March 5th





The Wyoming County 4-H Cookie Sale is currently the ONLY Fundraiser we ask our 4-H membership to participate in. This years sale will be a pre-sale similar to the past few sales.

We hope this will provide families an opportunity to sell cookies, by the package, to help support our program. Without this fundraiser, our program offerings would be limited, or more costly to 4-H families. We strongly encourage all 4-H families to participate if possible in the 2023 cookie sale. If every 4-H member sold even two cases (24 packages!) worth of cookies, this sale would be considered successful. If participation is low this year, we may have to move towards enforcing fundraiser participation in the upcoming 4-H year. Please do not hesitate to contact our office with any follow up questions or concerns.

2023 Selling Period: Monday February 20, 2023 - Sunday March 5, 2023

To keep the sale fair, cookies cannot be sold outside of the selling period

All payment and orders will be due to the cookie chairs by Monday, March 6th.

Selling Price: \$4.00 per package; \$48.00 per case(s) of 12 packages.

Cookies may be ordered by the package or by the case.

Cookie Pick Up:

This year's cookie sale will be completely per-order AND pre-payment.

Cookies are targeted to be delivered the week of April 17th. 4-H parents/leaders will be required to pickup their cookie orders as soon as possible. Calls will be made to all members who placed orders on exact delivery date/ time.

Cookie Returns:

Cases of cookies may NOT be returned this year. Cookies should be handled with care!

Incentives:

Incentive sheets must be turned into the 4-H office with your cookie order on March 6th.

2023 Only gift certificates will be offered for incentive prize. Incentive will be based off of full case sales only. If leaders collect members sales to benefit their club, the 4-H office needs to be notified before the sale begins.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS



The Public Presentation Program is frequently referred to as "the most beneficial and rewarding experience of all 4-H experiences". Public presentations give 4-H members an excellent opportunity to research a subject, organize ideas in logical order, develop visual aids and learn to speak effectively before groups. With each public presentation, there is an increase in self-confidence, poise, self-esteem, stage presence and knowledge. Public presentations can teach a 4-H'er lifetime skills that will be useful in his or her future social, educational and career pursuits.

It is important for 4-H'ers to begin doing Public Presentations at an early age and continue throughout their 4-H career. Public speaking skills develop over time, with experience and repetition.





FOR DISTRICT PRESENTATIONS

Any member who is interested in being considered for District Public Presentations will need to indicate that on the pre-registration form. We will have a dedicated room for those presentations and the same judges will evaluate each presenter. Judges in the other rooms may also encourage a 4-H member who gives an excellent presentation to present again for the District Judges. At the conclusion of the presentations, the district judges will select the presenters that will represent Wyoming County at Western District Public Presentations.

In STEAM Clothing 1: FUNdamentals, youth will gather the tools they'll need to begin sewing, understand textiles through fun science experiments, learn beginning math and engineering techniques in clothing construction, and take their skills a step further, investigating businesses, service learning projects, and modeling. This curriculum is a combined leader/youth guide, with pages to print off for youth to complete as part of the activities. FUNdamentals also introduces youth to the idea of a portfolio to document their work and track their progress as sewers by creating samples. Ages 8-10 | Beginning Level | 164 pages

In STEAM Clothing 2: Simply Sewing, youth will prepare for more advanced sewing techniques and projects, conduct more advanced textile science experiments, focus on advanced engineering techniques, add finishing touches and style to garments, and market and calculate prices of products. This curriculum is a combined leader/youth guide, with pages to print/copy for youth to complete as part of the activities. Simply Sewing builds upon the skills learned in FUNdamentals and continues the development of the portfolio. 198 pages

In STEAM Clothing 3: A Stitch Further, youth will learn the advanced, couture techniques used by designers to create unique garments. Youth will take the science of textiles a step further, and learn to sew garments with challenging patterns and fabrics, couture sewing techniques, and how to sell your professional-looking garments and accessories. A Stitch Further builds upon the skills developed in Simply Sewing and FUNdamentals and continues the development of the portfolio. 150 pages

In **Beyond the Needle**, youth will learn all about the 'A' in STEAM Clothing -- the Art! This youth manual includes activities for three skill levels: beginner, intermediate, and advanced. Youth will learn the design basics and create a portfolio to exhibit samples made to practice specific techniques. Then, youth will be able to create their own fabulous embellishments and treatments on garments. If you love art, then this STEAM Clothing manual is for you!

MARCH 20TH- 24TH



Horse Certificates must be in file on the 4-H office for each individual horse and rider combination to be used in 4-H events. They are due June 1st which is a Wednesday this year, no exceptions. Certificates are available online at wyomingcounty4h.com or in the 4-H office.

All 4-H members participating in the horse program must fill out an Acknowledgement of Risk Form with appropriate horse activities checked. This was part of your enrollment packet this year. This paperwork must be on file in the 4-H office in order to participate in any 4-H riding activities. Call the 4-H office with any questions.

Make sure up to date Rabies & Coggins paperwork is on your person at shows! Copies need to be submitted to the 4-H office with fair entries by July 15th!

DISTRICT GOAT BOWL


District Goat Bowl will be **Saturday**, April 1st at Oakfield School.

Continuing Meat Animal Program Requirement YOUTH QUALITY CARES ANIMALS

This online program is designed to provide an estimated 60 minutes of education each year and requires the passing of a series of three quizzes to earn certification. Each Wyoming County 4-H Meat Animal Project youth participant will be required to complete the online certification process (yqca.org) each project year. Proof of completion (certificate) must be submitted to the 4-H office. This requirement is IN ADDITION to the livestock educational event requirement outlined in the 2023 4-H meat animal rules.

There is a fee for the online program. 4-H Families may choose to pay for it on their own OR contact the 4-H office for a voucher/coupon for each youth member.
