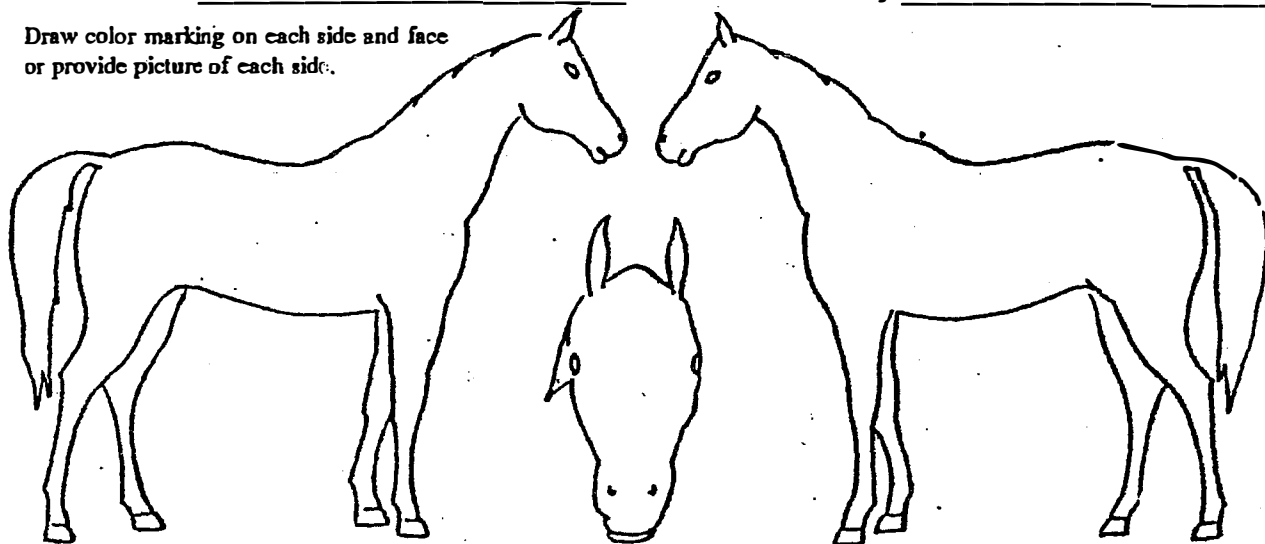

# Wyoming County 4-H Horse Certification Rules

- 1. If several children in a family have a horse certified in their names, they can all use the horse BUT in different performance classes. For example, John rides the horse in Western Pleasure; Sue rides it in Western Equitation. (NO to John riding Junior Western Pleasure and Sue riding Senior Western Pleasure.)**
- 2. If a 4-H'er owns a horse and certifies it, another youth from the community could lease that horse (if they do not own one.) Both 4-H'ers could ride the horse BUT it has to be in different show divisions. For example, Joe rides the horse in Gymkhana; Sam rides it in the Western Division.**
- 3. First and second year riders aged 12 and under are eligible to ride in Walk-Trot, Walk-Jog classes. They can use any certified horse (certified by themselves or any other 4-H'er) in any Walk-Trot, Walk-Jog class. Novice riders may also use any certified horse (certified by themselves or any other 4-H'er) in any Novice class.**
- 4. One certificate is required to be on file in the 4-H office for each individual horse and rider combination. These certificates only need to be updated if the horse or rider information has changed. For example, if you are riding the same horse as last year and the horse's ownership has not changed, you do NOT need to submit a new certificate to the 4-H office.**
- 5. If you lease a horse, the leased horse MUST be used in all riding classes that you participate in. For example, if Sam is riding a certified leased horse, she must use it in Western, English and Gymkhana.**
- 6. If you ride at a the Junior level at the State Fair Qualifying Show, you must also ride in the Junior Level at the Fair, NOT novice or Walk/Trot.**
- 7. A current EIA (Coggins) certificate must be on file with the 4-H office in order to participate in the current years shows. A current test is one done during the current year or the previous year. (For example, a valid test for the 2019 fair would be dated in 2018 or 2019). A current and valid Rabies certificate is also required.**
- 8. You may also lease a donkey, mule, and miniature horse if you do not own one. This is in addition to a horse or pony.**

Special Notice: to be eligible to show at the Wyoming County Fair, a foal born this year must either be from a mare registered to the member before June 1<sup>st</sup> this year or the foal itself must be registered with the 4-H office before June 1<sup>st</sup> this year. No foals acquired after June 1<sup>st</sup> this year may be exhibited.
