



Participation in the 4-H clothing and textiles project builds self-esteem, develops a sense of accomplishment, and allows youth to express their individuality by tapping into their personal creativity! On April 17th and 26th eleven 4-H members had their sewing projects evaluated on all aspects of clothing construction including choice of fabric, sewing, and finishing details, as well as fit in preparation for the revue.
4-H members participated in the evening's revue on May 9th, which featured a fashion show with twenty garments modeled by those members who completed a clothing project. 4-H'ers modeled an array of garments including aprons, dresses, and pajama pants and shirts. The 4-H'ers had

a chance to model on stage while being evaluated on fit, poise, posture, and style

of the item they had sewn.

WNY District Youth Lead Amongst New York State Dairy Bowl Competitors

[Wyoming County, NY – April 29, 2025] – The 4-H Dairy Bowl competition engages youth across the state, providing a platform for learning and showcasing knowledge about New York's number 1 agricultural industry - dairy. The competition stems from coaching and knowledge cultivated around the state through county extension office 4-H dairy programs. The competitions are tailored for youth ages 8 to 19 who are passionate about a variety of dairy industry topics.

Participants in the Dairy Bowl compete in "quiz bowl" format, where teams of four answer questions posed by a moderator, earning points accordingly. The 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl offers individual youth the chance to compete by answering questions that cover topics like dairy nutrition, milk quality, herd health, breeding and genetics, and industry-related current events. The competitions are open to teams, divided into age divisions: the junior division for participants under 14 and the senior division for those 14 and older, with specific eligibility criteria in place. 4-H also offers quiz bowls in addition to other educational opportunities for young people to learn about horses, goats, and other types of livestock and food production without needing to be on the farm.

The State Dairy Bowl Contest which is held each year in April at Cornell University is organized by Deborah Grusenmeyer, Senior Extension Associate, PRO-DAIRY, Animal Science. Deborah collaborates and works closely with county 4-H Extension educators by providing educational material, resources, and guidance. Locally, Mrs. Grusenmeyer collaborates with local 4-H educators like CCE Wyoming County 4-H Educator, Stephanie Czerniak.

The competitive yet supportive environment fosters teamwork, alertness, self-confidence, and mastery of dairy science. Hayden Ayers, a participant from Wyoming County, shared, "Dairy Bowl has been a great opportunity for me to learn more about the dairy industry as a whole. It has also allowed me to meet kids across the state who share the same passion for dairy that I do and create lifelong friendships."

"I am grateful to Will Herrick for all the time he dedicates to coaching Dairy Bowl. His commitment is what has allowed me and our teams to be so successful in our competitions!" Hayden continued.

YOUTH BUILDING EXHIBITS

All youth building exhibits must be entered and judged on **FRIDAY, AUGUST 8TH!**Judging Hours will be 1PM to 7PM. Exhibits to be judged on Friday include: Clothing, Home Improvement, Food, Booths, Flowers, Vegetables, Woodworking, Photography, Woodworking, Natural Resources, STEM, etc.! Refer to the department H sections 14-20. Vouchers must be properly filled in before coming to the fair. Double entry cards must be completely filled out and securely attached to exhibit.

If youth are unable to be present for judging (health reasons, work, etc.) exhibitors must call the 4-H office by Friday, July 25th to make special arrangements to enter items on Saturday, August 9th between 9AM and 11AM.

PICK UP EXHIBITS: Saturday, August 16th between 4PM and 8PM in the Youth Building or premium money may be forfeited. Additional pick up hours of Sunday, August 17th 12:00-2:00pm.




The 1st place blue ribbon booth will receive an additional \$15, 2nd place \$10, and 3rd place \$5.


BUCKET OF JUNK

Cloverbud's and Animal Projects

The Wyoming County 4-H program does allow cloverbuds to exhibit small animal projects (poultry, rabbits and cavies) and leadline horses at the Wyoming County Fair. These projects should be animals that the youth members own and care for on a regular basis, beginning by at least June. Cloverbuds who wish to bring a small animal to fair can choose one poultry animal, one rabbit/cavy, or one each of poultry and rabbit.

Cloverbud exhibitors will bring their project animals to fair just like older exhibitors on the day their species arrives and house them at the fairgrounds for the entire duration of the fair. Cloverbud members will be expected to care for their project animals each day at the fair. Depending on how many entries we receive, cloverbuds may be asked to take animals home after the show.

When it comes time for showing cloverbud small animals, keep in mind there is no competition. This opportunity is provided for cloverbuds to be able to experience bringing small animals to the fair, caring for them, and learning about how to show for the future. On show day for each particular species, cloverbuds will have the opportunity for a "mock show" where they will do showmanship with a volunteer. In order to prepare for this, we highly encourage each cloverbud exhibitor to attend a poultry or rabbit club meeting/showmanship clinic.

Cloverbud exhibitors <u>WILL NEED</u> to fill out a regular animal fair entry form and turn in to the 4-H office by July 15th. Please contact the 4-H office with questions or for more details.

- ★ Please bring your Cloverbud projects to be displayed at the County Fair on Friday, August 8, 2025.
- ★Note: Cloverbuds have special exhibit tags which are available at the 4-H office.
- Cloverbuds ARE required to fill out a voucher for youth building exhibits. The special exhibit tag for cloverbuds will still be in use.

Reminder that <u>no Dept. H exhibitors</u> are permitted to stay overnight in the barns while participating in youth activities at the fair. Any Dept. H exhibitor that will be staying in a camper on the fairgrounds must be accompanied by a parent or guardian, 21 years of age or older.

Exhibitors staying on the fairgrounds overnight in a camper <u>MUST</u> have their parent or guardian fill out an exemption form from the 4-H office. The exemption form needs to be on file in the 4-H office by the opening day of the fair and must be signed by the parent/guardian and chaperone.

SUMMARY OF ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE WYOMING COUNTY FAIR

A complete summary of health requirements can be found in the front of the Fair Book!

- 1. Rabies shots must be given to cattle, horses, dogs, and sheep that are 3 months of age or older on the date of admission to the fair. It is recommended that rabies shots also be given to goats and hogs. The vaccine must be given within the last 12 months. When a booster shot is given to a previously vaccinated animal, the shot must be given prior to coming to the fair.
- 2. Animals must be free of all contagious diseases such as ringworm, warts, mange, orf, respiratory infections and contagious hoof infections. Warts must be removed and healed prior to coming to fair.
- 3. Cattle, Sheep, Goats and Swine must be identified by USDA approved official identification. Call the 4-H office if you have any questions about acceptable forms of ID.
- 4. For New York State animals, certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) is required. This is a health chart (Form AI 61). The CVI is often referred to as "health papers" or "health certificate." This chart must be completed on or after May 1st of the current year. All animals, even those under 3 months of age, need to be individually identified and included on the health chart.
- 5. Tuberculosis testing on New York State cattle will not be required.
- 6. A signed written statement from the attending veterinarian is required as proof of vaccination.
- 7. Cattle must be vaccinated against Bovine Respiratory Disease Complex (shipping fever, etc. Vaccination must include immunization against bovine viral diarrhea (BVD), bovine respiratory syncytial virus (BRSV), infectious bovine rhinotracheitis(IBR), and Parainfluenza(PI3) with a product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of fair.
- 8. Observe milk and meat drug/vaccine labeled withholding times. (Usually 21 days is required between giving a rabies shot and slaughter and 21 days on the Bovine Respiratory shots.)
- 9. Out of state animals coming to the fair must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species. The interstate health chart is valid for 30 days from the date of issuance with regard to entrance into New York State. Import test requirements are different for different states, based on diseases that are found in that state. For more detailed information contact N. Y.S. Department of Ag and Markets at 518-457-3971 or online atwww.agmkt. ny.us.
- 10. If any sheep or goat within a flock shows evidence of Soremouth, the whole flock must be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 11. Sheep and goats must be identified with an official scrapie tag or tattoo. In order to prevent scrapie contamination, any sheep or goat showing any uterine drainage will be sent home.

Observe drug/vaccine labeled withholding times!

Cattle

- Health chart

- All cattle must be identified by a USDA approved RFID eartag.
- Vaccination for Bovine respiratory disease complex
- Negative BVD-PI Test results; date of test and results must be noted on CVI.

Sheep

- Health chart with veterinarian statement indicating that there are no contagious diseases in the flock/herd.
- Rabies vaccination
- Identified with an official scrapie tag or tattoo

Horses

- Coggins test for E.I.A., must be done in 2024 or 2025.
- Rabies vaccination-signed statement of vaccination by vet, must include serial number and name of product used.

Goats

- Health chart with veterinarian statement indicating that there are no contagious diseases in the flock/herd.
- Rabies vaccination is recommeded for fair!
- Identified with an official scrapie tag or tattoo

Swine

- Health chart with animals individually listed.
- All swine must be identified with a USDA approved eartag
- Vets <u>MUST</u> record entire tag number sequence on the
- CVI (example: 21HOG1234)
- Rabies vaccination is strongly recommended for county fair but is required for state fair.

Poultry

- No health chart.
- Pullorum Test/Certificate required on certain animals. See page 26 for details.

Rabbits

- No health chart.
- Rabbits will be checked for general health at show check in
- Rabbits must have legible ear tattoo

BIOSECURITY AT THE FAIR

These practices contribute to keeping your animals healthy and help to protect Wyoming County Agriculture. Adapted from California Department of Food and Agriculture, Biosecurity at the Fair brochure.

BIOSECURITY BEFORE THE FAIR

Disease prevention and fair biosecurity start before exhibitors leave home. Only healthy animals should be entered in the fair. Before animals leave the home premises, the herd or flock veterinarian should examine each animal to ensure healthy animals enter the fairgrounds. Tools and equipment may harbor disease agents. To minimize potential disease spread from the home premises to the fair, before packing for transport, clean and disinfect: Feed equipment: buckets, feeders, hay racks. Cleaning utensils: shovels, pitch forks and wheelbarrows. Grooming equipment: clippers and brushes. Vehicle and trailer (inside and outside).

BIOSECURITY A T **THE FAIR**

To protect fair animals and minimize disease transmission risk while at the fair: Limit animal-animal contact. Limit animal-human-animal contact. Avoid sharing equipment with other exhibitors unless you thoroughly clean and disinfect between use. Cover feed and equipment to reduce risk of contamination. Change clothing, hats, and shoes used at the fair before doing chores at home. At the end of the fair, clean all animals returning home and disinfect all equipment before loading the trailer. Unused feed, hay and bedding should be discarded at the fairgrounds, not taken home.

BIOSECURITY A FT ER THE FAIR

The possibility of animal exposure to disease agents can occur with even the best biosecurity practices at the fair. Since they may be harboring disease agents without clinical signs, animals returning from the fair should be isolated from other animals and pets. Monitor animals in isolation daily for signs of illness and contact the herd or flock veterinarian if any unusual symptoms are observed. To minimize the possible chance of disease spread to the main herd or flock, modify your chore routine to care for isolated fair animals last. Keep equipment used in caring for isolated fair animals away from other animals in the herd or flock. Change your clothes after completing chores for isolated animals. Consult your veterinarian to develop an isolation plan suitable for your premises and herd or flock. Use of fair biosecurity is a good management practice.

MEAT ANIMAL MID-WAY WEIGHT CHECK

Saturday, July 19th

10am – 12pm at the Wyoming County Fairgrounds

This is an opportunity for meat animal participants to bring project animals to the fair for a weight check if you do not have access to scales at home. You will be responsible for offloading, getting your animals to and from the scales, and reloading them on your truck or trailer. This is totally optional but a good opportunity if you are unsure of how your project animals are doing in terms of weight.

*Beef cattle must be well halter broke if you plan to utilize this option

*Vets must inspect entire flock/herd for sheep and goat CVI's - if you have additional sheep and/or goats at home, this is NOT a good option for fair Health charts; you should contact your vet directly!

- Entry forms will be available online and in the office as soon as the fairbooks arrive. Please write in stabling requests on your entry forms. Don't forget you must attach a clear, readable, current copy of your Coggins and Rabies certificates to your horse show entry form which is due on July 15th. Entries will not be valid without submission of these forms.
- Remember riders MUST use "certified horses" for the Wyoming County Fair!
- Make sure your helmet contains the approved ASTM-1163/SEI or ASTM-F-1163-04a/SEI certification and that the helmet is in good condition!
- Proper equestrian footwear with a distinguishable heel and an approved helmet shall be worn at all times that a rider is mounted on an equine, sitting in a cart or handling an equine in a riding arena (whether on the ground, mounted or seated in a cart) at a 4-H sponsored clinic or show. This includes the Costume Class.
- Remember that in order to participate in the 2025 Wyoming County Fair 4-H Horse Shows, 4-H'ers must participate in an educational event or activity during the current project year. Call the 4-H office ASAP if you are unsure if you have fufilled this requirement.

We encourage all horse program participants to come and help clean up the barns before fair! Please bring supplies to help get the barns in top shape for your horses. When cleaning wraps up, we will play stick horse games and have a check-in meeting to confirm we have enough volunteers for the duration of fair.

Biosecurity for Horse Events

Any time horses are congregated at events, owners increase the chance that their horses may be exposed to an infectious disease agent. An example is EHV-1. Pathogens may be brought to and spread at an event by horses, people, domestic animals other than horses, vehicles, equipment, insects, ticks, birds, wildlife including rodents, feed, waste and water. By following these simple guidelines, you can help minimize that risk.

- Consult your veterinarian to establish an appropriate vaccination program for your horse(s).
- Tie your horse(s) to your trailer. If using a stall, clean and disinfect it, if possible, before stalling your horse. Always use clean, fresh bedding.
- Minimize your horse(s) having direct contact with unknown horses, especially nose to nose contact.
- Use your own water and feed buckets. Avoid letting your horse(s) drink from a communal water trough. Fill water buckets from a faucet.
- Do not share grooming equipment or tack. If you must, then wash and disinfect it before returning to your own horse(s).
- Avoid petting and touching other horses in order to minimize the risk of transferring a disease back to your horse. If you must handle other horses then wash your hands or use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid letting strangers pet your horse especially if they have horses of their own.
- Before returning home from an event clean up your equipment (boots, tack, grooming supplies, buckets, etc.) to help reduce the risk of transporting an infectious agent back home. Consider washing and disinfecting your trailer when you return home.
- If possible, isolate your returning horses for 2 weeks or at least prevent nose to nose contact with your other horses.

Don't forget to consult your veterinarian concerning these and other steps you can follow which may reduce the risk of your horse acquiring an infectious disease while traveling.
