DELICIOUS DESTINATIONS EXPLORING FOODS AROUND THE WORLD!

- Monday, April 15th 6:30pm setup, 7:00pm program begins Ag & Business Center, Warsaw
- Explore the different cuisines around the world, along with their cultures and heritage! There are hundreds of cultures and cuisines across the globe, we challenge you, as 4-H independent and club members, to select a country and research the origins of the foods they eat and their culinary histories and traditions! As a club (or independent member), pick a nation in the world you are interested in exploring! (No US regions). Over the next several months, gather information on the region's cuisine, including styles of cooking or special dishes, and the history or origins of the food item(s) or recipes. As an opportunity to highlight what members learn from participating in this experience, Wyoming County 4-H will host a 'Delicious Destinations Exploring Foods throughout the World' event on Monday evening, April 15th, 2024. Your club (or independent members) should be prepared to: Share samples of a food/dish that is representative of your region/city with other participants. All food samples must be prepared prior to the event and ready for distribution. Plan a short presentation (5 minutes max) to share what you have learned with others. Put together a small display highlighting what you learned by participating in the project (i.e. posters, photographs, clothing, recipes, etc.) Pre-registration is required as spacing is limited. 4-H SUMMER CAMP OPPORTUNITIES

- Since the closing of 4-H Camp Wyomoco, area youth may not know of other regional 4-H Camp opportunities. We are sharing exciting news from our partners at 4-H Camp Bristol Hills! 4-H Camp Bristol Hills is now accepting registration for the 2024 summer camp season. They offer a wide variety of Camp programs including the ever-popular Resident Camp (going into 3rds grade and up) and Day Camp (going into k-2nd grade), but they also offer Progression Camp (day-only program for 3rd grade and up) and even Sprout camp, an overnight camp for those going into 1st-3rd grades. On top of that, Specialty programs appeal to those who are a little older, and want to take the deep dive! Animation camp is designed for those who want to learn basic animation skills using sketch pads, iPads, cameras and more. Adventure Program invites campers to explore the full ropes course program, including the high ropes cables and logs suspended over 20' in the trees! For those who are thinking about getting into the workforce, the Leader in Training program provides an introduction to the basic workforce skills that will support your efforts in any job, while the two week Counselor in Training program takes it a step further, and introduces many of the skills that it takes to be a successful camp counselor.
- For those campers in Resident and Progression Camps, you'll be able to sign up for your favorite camp classes when you register for camp. Pick your lineup with popular options like swim lessons, animal care, archery, crafts, cooking, adventure (ropes course), hiking, outdoor survival and so much more. • Empower youth to pursue their sparks and make meaningful impacts! NYS 4-Hers age 12-18 are invited apply for the <u>Youth Contribution Project</u>. Led by the <u>PRYDE Scholars</u>, this is an opportunity for youth to receive \$200 to support their idea for making a meaningful contribution. 50 ideas will be selected randomly to receive funding. A contribution is an act of giving or donating something valuable, whether it's money, time, effort, skills, resources, or ideas, for the purpose of

making a positive impact or difference. This is intentionally broad. We believe that any idea can be a meaningful contribution. Youth will have approximately a month to work on their projects. Note that we are considering the feasibility of ideas – ideas that can be completed or a step toward a larger goal that can be completed within the project timeframe. Check out the project <u>FAQs</u> for more information. Any 4-Her age 12-18 in NYS is eligible to apply. All applications must name at least one 4-H member and an adult partner who works with CCE. The adult partner will support youth as they complete their contribution project and help them access funds, which will be dispersed to the CCE Association. PRYDE Scholars will support youth-adult teams through <u>project resources</u>. How will NYS 4-Hers contribute? Let us count the ways!
